




#### The Impact of Covid-19 on the UK Immigration System

- Following the first UK lockdown, the Home Office published an initial picture of the system wide impacts last May covering:
  - Passenger arrivals
  - Entry clearance visas
  - Extensions of leave
  - EU Settlement Scheme
  - Asylum and Resettlement
  - Immigration Detention



### The Impact of Covid-19 on the UK Immigration System reporting

- Subsequent integration of Covid-19 reporting within quarterly immigration chapters
- Overall picture as of 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 2020 numbers fell sharply across the whole immigration system in Q2 following the Covid-19 outbreak, but numbers have started to recover in Q3 for most areas but are still below normal levels
- Also publishing a separate passenger arrivals report on a quarterly basis using API data

# The Future Borders & Immigration System (FBIS)

- One of the most significant changes resulting from the UK leaving the EU is the ending of free movement and the introduction of a new immigration system which will apply to all nationalities (except British and Irish citizens) who wish to come to or stay in the UK from 01 Jan 2021
- The new routes launched mark the start of a multi-year programme of change to transform the operation of the border and immigration

system. The changes are being rolled out in a phased approach to ensure the smooth delivery of the new system and to allow enough time for everyone to adapt



#### The Future Borders & Immigration System (FBIS) - data

- What does this mean for immigration data?
  - We will continue to publish our regular quarterly immigration statistics
  - This will be expanded to include any new visa routes as they come onboard throughout 2021
  - Statistics on the numbers applying to and granted under the new Immigration system will be reported, as we do now, for individual visa categories



#### The Future Borders & Immigration System (FBIS) - statistics


- Quarterly Immigration Stats (YE Dec 2020)
  - Where routes went live between Oct and Dec 2020, data will be published on 25<sup>th</sup> February 2021
  - This includes routes relating to:
    - Students
    - Child Students
    - Skilled workers General
    - Skilled workers Health and Care Workers
    - Frontier workers
    - Other permit free employment
    - Intra company transfers

# The Future Borders & Immigration System (FBIS)

- Back office systems development throughout 2021
  - Transition & integrate old casework systems with new case working systems
- Share administrative data to test and develop data matching processes across government
  - Facilitate new innovative analyses and insights of government held data
- Lots of development work this year and beyond
  - New systems, quality assessment, data matching development
  - Much richer resource in years to come
  - Better analysis of migrants and their interaction with the immigration systems
  - Deeper understanding for groups of migrants where additional data is available

### **Working with ONS**


- Secondment Programme set up in 2020
  - Enable ONS analysts to work directly with Home Office admin data systems and data experts in house
  - Programme of development work across both departments using Home Office Exit Checks data
  - Examples of work streams include, exploring admin data to measure long term migration, data matching development, data quality development etc.

- Private & Public Beta testing
  - (28 Aug 2018 29 March 2019)
- Live launch of the EUSS
  - (30 March 2019)
- First monthly stats publication
  - (30 May 2019)
- First quarterly stats publication
  - (22 Aug 2019)



#### The EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS) New Data

- Recently data based on user feedback
  - Inclusion of paper applications (+10,000)
  - Inclusion of a derivative right to reside in the UK (4,000)
  - Local Authority children in care survey
- It is our intention to publish additional detail on repeat applicants later this year
- Upcoming publications
  - Monthly stats (up to 31<sup>st</sup> Jan) 11<sup>th</sup> Feb
  - Quarterly stats (up to  $31^{st}$  Dec)  $25^{th}$  Feb

### Changes & Improvements in response to user feedback

Our response during the Coronavirus Pandemic Development of EUSS Statistics Secondment Programme for Exit Checks

- New format data tables
  - summary tables of the key statistics
  - detailed datasets combining previous tables into one with additional variables (e.g. nationality, sex, age etc.)
- Migrant Journey data including age and sex
- Accessibility compliance across all publications
